His essay sparked a heated debate among Polish intelligentsia over Poland's responsibililty for the Holocaust and its past relationship to Polish Jews. This book republishes some of the most trenchant and provocative essays of the debate (including Blonski's original). It highlights Polish intellectuals' wrestling with an unresolved, haunting issue and reveals the spectrum of Polish attitudes. The book concludes with a transcript of discussions between Polish and Israeli scholars at a 1988 conference on Polish Jewry held in Israel. Very well done, this book is recommended for those interested in Polish-Jewish history, the Holocaust, and post-Holocaust ethnic and national reconciliation .- Benny Kraut, Univ. of Cincinnati

Shapiro, Michael. The Shadow in the Sun: A Korean Year of Love and Sorrow.

Atlantic, dist. by Little, Brown. Jun. 1990. c.252p. LC 89-77933. ISBN 0-87113-357-1. \$19.95. INT AFFAIRS Veteran journalist Shapiro combines insightful analysis of political and economic forces with dramatic human portraits of individual South Koreans who struggle to conduct the business of everyday life in the midst of political turbulence. While somewhat comparable to Michael Stephens's Lost in Seoul and Other Discoveries on the Korean Peninsula (LJ2/15/90), this book emphasizes the political forces at work in the rapidly changing climate of Korean culture. A winter 1990 postscript adds a somber note, since it describes recent setbacks to South Korea's progress. This work will be highly useful for general audiences as well as specialists in understanding the human dimensions of South Korea's journey from a police state to a budding democracy. Barrett, Nina. I Wish Someone Had Told Me...: Comfort, Support, and Advice for New Moms from More Than Sixty Real-Life Mothers.

Fireside: S. & S. 1990. c.237p. ISBN 0-671-66949-4. pap. \$9.95. This book is based on the adage that there is solace in knowing that others have problems similar to one's own. Having interviewed 63 women, all in the first year of motherhood, Barrett explores women's expectations regarding pregnancy, labor, and motherhood, and how delivery and motherhood are affected by these expectations. She encourages new mothers to trust their instincts regardless of what the child-care books advise. Breastfeeding is not for everyone, a Mary Poppins is unlikely to be waiting eagerly in the wings to take care of your baby, a new closeness may not develop between you and your mother, and your relationship with your husband may be severely strained. In brief: Barrett makes new mothers aware that giving birth to a baby is like giving birth to a new self—a process that reworks ambitions, relationships, and self-image.—Jodith Janes, Cleveland Clinic Foundation

Freud, Sigmund. Freud on Women: A Reader.

Norton, Jul. 1990, c.338p. ed. by Elisabeth Young-Bruehl. bibliog. index. ISBN 0-393-02822-4. \$25. Freudian scholar Young-Bruehl chronologically assembles Freud's writings on women while remaining mainly neutral regarding feminist critiques of his views. Hoping to "discourage . . . simplistic versions of what Freud supposedly said about women," she has selected about 20 entries, the pivotal one being "Three Essays on the Theory of Sexuality" in which Freud expressed his belief in human bisexuality. By means of a lengthy introduction, commentaries, and an annotated bibliography, she documents Freud's evolution in thinking about female psychology, including his concepts on narcissism, mother attachment, penis envy, and woman's "flexible" superego. General readers may feel overwhelmed by the jargon and scholarly style, but this title will doubtless find a welcome place in most feminist and/or psychology collections.-Janice Arenofsky, formerly with Arizona State Lib., Phoenix

Greif, Geoffrey L. The Daddy Track and the Single Father.

It is becoming more common for men to be single parents. Widowers may not remarry; divorced dads seek custody. And while many single-parenting problems are common to both sexes, some are peculiar to single fathers, e.g., dealing with a teenaged daughter or making the necessary adjustment at work, especially when the employer is not sympathetic. Greif explores these and other real-life situations of single fathers. He dispels myths, describes how single fathers have coped, and provides practical advice on topics from housekeeping to dating to dealing with courts and ex-wives. This well-written book provides encouragement and help to single fathers and enlightenment to those who think single parenting is for women only.—John Moryl, Yeshiva Univ. Lib., N.Y.
